ROGER WEISBERG, Producer/Director

Roger Weisberg's previous 25 documentaries have won over one hundred awards, including Emmy, DuPont-Columbia, and Peabody awards as well as two recent Academy Award nominations. Many of Weisberg's previous documentaries have taken viewers inside the health care system, including SOUND AND FURY, WHAT'S AILING MEDICINE, OUR CHILDREN AT RISK, BORDERLINE MEDICINE, WHO LIVES - WHO DIES, and CAN'T AFFORD TO GROW OLD. CRITICAL CONDITION builds on this two-decade body of work in order to engage viewers in the national debate over how to extend health insurance coverage to all Americans.
